## Laptop Program

Cleveland District State High School is currently running the very successful 1-to-1 Laptop Program for Years 8, 9, 11 and 12. The transition to the Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) program commenced this year for Years 7 and 10.

The 1-to-1 Laptop Program enables students to loan a school owned device enabling a personalized 1-to-1 learning environment for students. Cost to participate in the School 1-to-1 program is \$200 + Student Resource Scheme (SRS) fees.

Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) is a new pathway supporting the delivery of 21st century learning. It is a term used to describe a digital device ownership model where students use their personally owned mobile devices to access the department's ICT network. It is important that parents make informed choices about laptop selection, software, warranty, accidental damage cover and virus protection.
