The Cleveland Project

In 2016, Cleveland District State High School has teamed up with a local charity called "LIVIN" which focusses on removing the stigma attached to mental health issues, to create The Cleveland Project. The Cleveland Project is a yearlong initiative that aims to increase the level of awareness and acceptance of, mental health issues at CDSHS. There are four phases within this project:

- Phase 1 – Youth Mental Health First Aid Course – for teachers and parents.

- Phase 2 – Teen Mental Health First Aid. 3.5 hours of curriculum time for Year 10 students during Senior Study Skills, in Terms 2 and 3.
- Phase 3 – Assembly – LIVIN WELL presentation from Sam Webb and Casey Lyons (CEOs of LIVIN).
- Phase 4 – Developing links to local service providers in and around CDSHS.

The Youth Mental Health First Aid course for parents and teachers commences on Wednesday 27 April at Cleveland High School in Room T4, from 4.30pm-8.00pm. This course will run over four consecutive Wednesday evenings and will cover topics such as depression, anxiety problems, psychosis, substance use problems and eating disorders. Unfortunately registrations are now closed, however regular updates for this Project will be provided in future newsletters.

Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) Program

Cleveland District State High School will be totally BYOD next year. As the school owned 1-to-1 Laptop Program will be phased out this year, all students will access technology from their own devices. The purpose of this early notice is to alert parents/carers that in 2017 students will be required to purchase a suitable device. The device must meet minimum specifications to ensure connectivity to the school network. The Equity Loan program will continue to be run for students who require financial assistance.

The school has endeavoured to make the purchasing process as easy as possible by providing a minimum specification list that will cover most basic curriculum needs (Word Processing, Internet, Research, etc). If your student is studying more demanding subjects (Graphics, Art) it may be necessary to purchase a machine that has higher specification.

Costs involved in connecting BYOD laptop to the school network are currently covered in the Student Resource Scheme (SRS). Students will be required to submit a signed acceptance form and evidence of commencement of the SRS fees to be eligible to be connected to the school network. 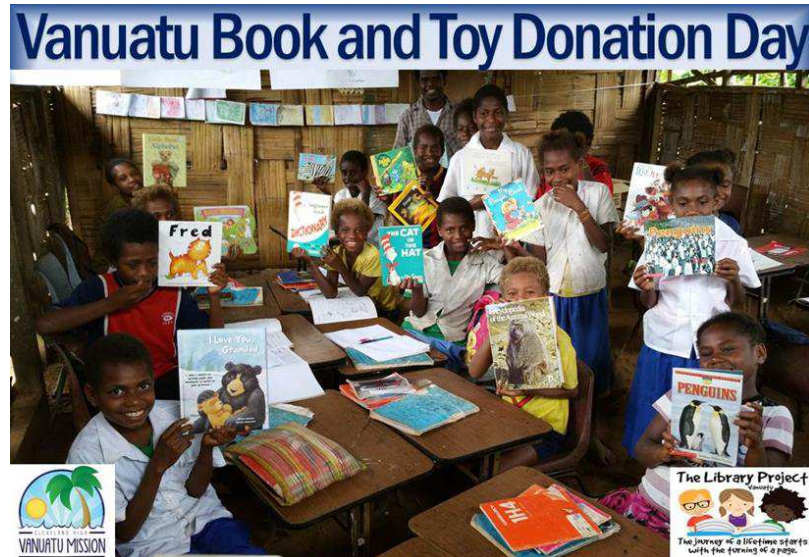
